Daily Pick up and Drop Off Reminders

A few friendly reminders for families during our pick up and drop off times:

- 1) Please refrain from pulling any U-turns when driving into or on the school grounds. Making U-turns causes safety concerns and traffic congestion. Please drive all the way in and use the drive-thru to change directions. Thank you for your help.
- 2) Please observe the 30 km/h School Zone speed limits that begin BEFORE you drive onto 212 Street. Upon turning into the school entrance, please limit your speed to 10 km/h.
- 3) Ensure you are following physical distancing guidelines when interacting with other adults and please consider wearing a mask.

Our Reading Goal

Every school in Langley has an Action Plan for Learning where we set goals as a school community to intentionally learn and develop our teaching and learning plans. One of our two goals is to have as many students as possible reading at grade level before leaving West Langley. In the coming months we will be including regular updates and strategies for families and what they can do at home to practice the skills taught at school.

As you know, reading is not skill isolated to just English Language Arts study. Reading is a universal skill that students require in all curricular areas to access information, complete numeracy assignments, develop comprehension and critical thinking skills, and learn about the local and global community (just to name a few!). ALL students in EVERY grade are working on developing reading skills this year. Reading and learning does not stop at letter recognition and sight words!

Families can support our reading goal by:

- 1) Participating in your child's classroom home reading programs in the primary classes
- 2) Reading together as a family (both silently reading and doing read aloud books) as much as possible! Practice makes better!
- 3) Read out loud with your child/tween so they can hear fluent expression or read along together while listening to a novel on an app like the audible app.
- 4) Talking about the books you have read to check for understanding and begin to develop critical thinking skills about what they have read.
- 5) Encourage your older students to read daily or read the same book together and discuss!

Have you registered for Kindergarten 2021-2022?

Kindergarten Registration for the 2021-2022 school year will begin on January 18 and continue through to March 31, 2021. All children who will be five years old by December 31,

2021 are eligible to register for Kindergarten classes that will begin in September 2021. This year you will be able to register either online OR in person.

If you are interested in registering in-person, please call the office at (604) 888-6444 and speak with Mrs. Rinke to set up an appointment time.

Please check our school website for specific information about how to register. **YOU MUST REGISTER AT YOUR CATCHMENT SCHOOL.**

Proper documentation is required at the time of registration. **YOUR CHILD'S REGISTRATION WILL NOT BE PROCESSED WITHOUT THE REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION.**

Following is a list of required documents:

- Proof of Age (Birth Certificate, Passport).
- Proof of Citizenship or Permanent Resident Status for both child and parent (Canadian Birth Certificate, Canadian Citizenship Card, Canadian Passport, Landed Immigrant documentation, Permanent Resident documentation/cards)
- Proof of residence (Driver's License, utility bill mortgage statement, subject-free purchase agreement, municipal tax bill).
- Immunization Records (if available – school does not retain a copy)

Although your child's Care Card is not a required document, it is an important piece of information for the school to have. Please make sure that you have indicated any medical concerns or information that the school should be aware of (i.e. asthma, allergies, etc.). If you have copies of any medical documents or diagnostic reports for learning or physical needs, please also have a copy or the original (a copy can be made at the school). Please also have a copy of any court orders regarding custody so the school can have a copy on file.



What do I need to know?

1. **Masks:** We have WLE Masks (black with adjustable ear elastics) available for students and families to purchase for \$8.00 through SchoolCashOnline. While masks are not mandatory at elementary school, we are strongly encouraging our older students to please wear masks in common spaces such as hallways and washrooms. We do still have a limited number of reusable masks in

the office for students. If your child would like one, they can come to office to request one. Thank you to everyone for doing a great job following our health and safety protocols.



2. **Valentine's Day Cards:** While it is a long-standing tradition to exchange Valentine cards at West Langley, due to health and safety guidelines, we are asking families to not send cards or treats to school. Teachers and classes will do seasonal activities to celebrate which will follow our COVID-19 protocols. Thank you for your understanding. We appreciate everyone's support and efforts helping is adhere to guidelines set out by the Provincial Health Officer and School District which help reduce the risk of exposures in school.
3. **Kindergarten Registration:** The process for this year's Kindergarten Registration has changed. Please see the section titled Kindergarten Registration 2021-2022 for more information. We are encouraging families to register as soon as possible so we can confirm your registration for the year. Registrations received prior to March 31, 2021 are guaranteed placement at their catchment school. Registrations after March 31, 2021 will be placed on a waitlist for September.
4. **Daily Health Check Reminder:** Health and safety remain our top priority. A reminder to please be sure to review the daily health check form at the following link. Click [here](#)



5. **Weather Reminder:** We live on the West Coast and it rains – a lot! Students should be prepared with rain gear (boots, coats, umbrellas, change of clothes, etc.) as we will be going outside unless there are exceptional weather circumstances.

6. **When parents/guardians need to come to the building:** If you need to visit us in person, we ask

that all parents/guardians wait outside at the front door – please do not enter the building. If we miss you, please call us at 604-888-6444 and we will come to help you. Thank you for your cooperation.

Emergency Prep Drills

We will be conducting a “Lock Down Drill” on Friday, February 19 where our RCMP School Liaison office will be in attendance. Our RCMP School Liaison office visits the school weekly so many students know who she is and it is not uncommon to have RCMP at the school. Each year, schools must conduct multiple emergency procedure drills to ensure all adults and older students have a clear understanding of the routines. Our Lock Down drill will be communicated in advance to students with age-appropriate explanations being given and students reassured that is only practice and that they are safe. Families can support us by reminding students we do all sorts of emergency drills/practices throughout the year so we know routines which keeps everyone safe and calm.

Student Learning Surveys

Students in grade 4 and 7 will be participating in completing the annual survey this month in their classrooms.

Surveys are to be completed by parents with children in Grades 4, 7, 10, and 12. A parent may complete a survey for each child in the targeted grades.

Schools with no Grade 4 students will have parents of Grade 3 students complete the survey.

Foundational Skills Assessment (FSA) – Change of Administration Dates

The BC Ministry of Education has adjusted the administration dates for this year's Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA). All Langley students in grades 4 and 7 will now complete the FSA in the new administration window between February 15 and March 12, 2021. Information on the exact dates students will write their FSA's will be provided by your child's classroom teacher in the coming weeks. Parents of students in grade 4 and 7 would have received a letter in September from Gord Stewart, Superintendent of Langley Schools, regarding the annual Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA) for the 2020/2021 school year. The letter indicated that this year's FSA would be administered between October 5 and November 13, 2020. The remainder of the information outlined in the letter still applies and if parents have any questions regarding the FSA, they should contact their school's Principal.

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Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI)

THE MIDDLE YEARS DEVELOPMENT INSTRUMENT (MDI) IS COMING TO YOUR SCHOOL IN JANUARY/FEBRUARY!

The Langley School District has partnered with the Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP) at the University of British Columbia to measure and promote children's social and emotional development, health, well-being, and assets through the Middle Year Development Instrument (MDI). The Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) is a self-report questionnaire that asks children in middle childhood about their thoughts, feelings and experiences. The MDI is the first survey of its kind to gather information about the lives of children both in school, in the home and in the community, from their own perspective. The survey questions align with the BC Ministry of Education's K-12 curriculum, which includes a focus on promoting children's personal and social competencies.

Grade 5,6 and 8 students are invited to complete the MDI during class time between:
February 5th and March 5th, 2021.

Information About School Status During Inclement Weather?



Snow closures and power outages are an annual occurrence in Langley School District. So, where do you go to get information about the status of schools during periods of inclement weather?

If you are able to access the internet via computer or smartphone, current information about Langley schools can be accessed on all school websites or www.sd35.bc.ca. Updates are also posted to Twitter @LangleySchools and Facebook at www.facebook.com/langleyschooldistrict. If you don't have internet connectivity but your phone is working, call a relative or friend in an area that has not been affected by the storm and ask them to check the district website for you. Local radio stations are also informed of school status in Langley. Tune in to CKWX 1130AM, CKNW 980AM, Country Radio 107.1FM, Pulse 107.7 or CBC 690AM or 88.1FM for updates.

Please note that Langley District schools are all considered 'open' until a decision to close is required. Decisions on school closures are usually made by 6:30am. As always, it is a parent's decision whether to send their child to school based on safety and individual circumstances. If you feel it is unsafe for you or your child to travel to or attend an open school for any reason, please keep your child home and report an absence to the school.
