New Daily Health Check Form - Digital and Print Version



Thank you for continuing to conduct a daily health check with your child. It is an important measure to help keep our school community healthy and safe. To better assist families, the Ministry of Education has developed an online K to 12 Health Check which can be found here: https://www.k12dailycheck.gov.bc.ca/healthcheck

A mobile phone app version can also be downloaded, called K to 12 Health Checker.

What do I need to know?

1. When parents/guardians need to come to the building: If you need to visit us in person, we ask that all parents/guardians wait outside at the front door – please do not enter the building. If we miss you, please call us at 604-888-6444 and we will come to help you. Thank you for your cooperation.

2. Water Bottles: With the weather warming up, it is essential that students have a water bottle at school. Students are asked to bring a water bottle each day with their name on it. Our regular water fountains are currently shut off as per COVID-19 protocols and each student having a water bottle would be very helpful throughout the day. Students can fill up their water bottles at the water bottle filling station as needed throughout

the day.

- 3. **Masks:** We have WLE Masks (black with adjustable ear elastics) available for students and families to purchase for \$8.00 through SchoolCashOnline. We do still have a limited number of free reusable masks in the office for students. If your child would like one, they can come to office to request one.
- 4. **SchoolMessenger:** We have now completed tests by sending messages via Text, Email and Phone. For more information please visit Pkg-SchoolMessenger-2021Jan26.pdf

Updated Mask Protocols

On Monday, March 29, 2021, a new Provincial Health Order was issued specific to mask wearing for students in grades 4-12. Effective right away, all staff K-12 and students grades 4-12 are required to wear non-medical masks when indoors. If your child is in our grade 3/4 class, students in that grade 3 class only are also asked to wear a mask. Students in kindergarten to grade three are encouraged to wear a mask if possible. 1) Our next General PAC Meeting is scheduled for April 22, 2021 at 6:30pm.

At the next General PAC meeting, there will be a vote to amend the existing bylaws. Notification this motion was sent home to WLE families earlier this week. The motion being presented is:

I motion that WLE PAC makes an amendment to our Bylaws. Our current Bylaws state:

"5.4. No member of the executive shall be an employee or an elected official of any school district or of the Ministry of Education."

I suggest we change to the following language:

"A parent seeking a position on the Executive who is an employee or elected official of any school district or of the Ministry of Education shall disclose their relationship immediately and will not take part in any conversation or vote which presents and conflict of interest. If there is debate on whether a matter presents a conflict of interest, the President must call for a vote to determine if the subject matter presents a conflict. If the conflict of interest pertains to the President, the President will step aside and a VP will call for the vote."

This is the language that the Langley DPAC recently approved for their Bylaws, and will allow more of our parents the opportunity to take on an Executive position on the WLE PAC.

COVID-19 and Youth Mental Health

Since COVID-19

was declared a pandemic, many public health responses have been implemented including social distancing measures and school closures.

These measures may have an impact on the mental health of children and teens, and we need to adjust the type and amount of resources being offered to our children.

The MyHEARTSMAP team needs your help to measure how much and in what ways the changes in our lives during the pandemic have affected the social and psychological wellness of our children and youth.

Using the MyHEARTSMAP online psychosocial self-screening tool, children, youth, and (or) their parents, can learn about which aspects of their mental health may be of concern and might benefit from support resources, and where to find them in BC.

Learning about our children's needs will help guide our provincial mental health resource planning.

Who can participate in this study?

- Children and youth aged 10-17 in BC
- Parents with a child aged 6-17 in BC

What is involved?

- Answer questions about how COVID-19 has affected you
- Complete the MyHEARTSMAP Self-Screening Tool after enrolling, and again in 3 months
