New Daily Health Check Form – Digital and Print Version

Health Check	
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Thank you for continuing to conduct a daily health check with your child. It is an important measure to help keep our school community healthy and safe. To better assist families, the Ministry of Education has developed an online K to 12 Health Check which can be found here: https://www.k12dailycheck.gov.bc.ca/healthcheck

A mobile phone app version can also be downloaded, called K to 12 Health Checker.

Print versions are available in multiple languages on our District website here.

What do I need to know?

- 1. Please ensure you are conducting a health check with your children each day. Please see the K-12 Health Check included in every newsletter for guidance. While most of the time, we simply have colds, Fraser Health is advising even minor colds symptoms be checked out right now. While symptoms are minor, they can lead to transmission of COVID-19 back to households and to more senior adults in our community or workplaces. We would also like to encourage everyone to wear masks and for adults to practice physical distancing from those outside their households when dropping off and picking up. Thank you to everyone for your support, kindness and cooperation.
- 2. **Playgrounds closed afterschool.** Students and families are reminded that our playgrounds are closed before and after school. School staff will be outside to supervise and will request children and families to not use the playgrounds. Our onsite daycare will also be utilizing our playground

facilities and need the outdoor space. As such, all families are asked to proceed directly home after dismissal.

3. When parents/guardians need to come to the building: If you need to visit us in person, we ask that all parents/guardians wait outside at the front door – please do not enter the building. If we miss you, please call us at 604-888-6444 and we will come to help you. Thank you for your cooperation.



4. Water Bottles: With the weather warming up, it is essential that students have a water bottle at school. Students are asked to bring a water bottle each day with their name on it. Our regular water fountains are currently shut off as per COVID-19 protocols and each student having a water bottle would be very helpful throughout the day. Students can fill up their water bottles at the water bottle filling station as needed throughout the day.

- 5. Masks: We have WLE Masks (black with adjustable ear elastics) available for students and families to purchase for \$8.00 through SchoolCashOnline. We do still have a limited number of free reusable masks in the office for students. If your child would like one, they can come to office to request one.

Kindergarten Welcome!

We would like to welcome you to the West Langley Community and invite you to join us with your kindergarten student to our Kindergarten Welcome event.

On May 12 between 2:30pm and 5:00pm, West Langley Elementary will be hosting our Kindergarten Welcome meet and greet. At this time, your child will be able to meet the kindergarten teachers, Ms. Diane from Strongstart and Ms. Crockett, our school librarian, and receive an activity bag to keep. You will also receive information about the school entry process (gradual entry) and what September will look like for your kindergarten child. After meeting the teachers, you will receive an email with further details on how you and your kindergarten child can use the activity bag to continue learning at home.

In June, you will receive more detailed information about the gradual entry process, including a schedule for the first few weeks of school. In August, you will begin to receive Back to School information about West Langley and our return to school plan.

Due to COVID protocols, we are asking everyone attending our Kindergarten Welcome to consider driving as it will be a drive-through event only. We ask that all family members

attending remain in your car. If you are unable to drive, we ask that you follow the signs posted and practice physical distancing expectations.

Outdoor Learning

As the weather is improving, we are being encouraged by Public Health and our District to take students outside as much as possible.

Please help us ensure your children are prepared to be outside. Please help your child apply sunscreen before the school day and ensure your child knows how to apply sunscreen on their face, neck and arms. (No aerosol or spray bottles please)

Students should bring (all clearly labelled):

- Hat
- Sunglasses
- Sunscreen (no aerosol or spray bottles please)
- Full, labelled water bottle every day as our water fountains are shut off with the exception of our water bottle filling fountain. Many families are already doing this, and we appreciate your ongoing support.

• Active Footwear and clothing as we will spending more time being active outside, including gym activities and we want to ensure all students are able to participate.

Please remember to treat our outside space as an extension of our classroom and not approach classes while outside as we are learning. If you need to drop your child off late or pick up early, we ask everyone to continue to use the school office sign in/sign out process.

<u>Dogs on School Grounds</u>

First, as much as our whole staff and most of our community love dogs, there are some members for whom dogs bring on significant anxiety, and who can find it stressful to have dogs, no matter how friendly, waiting at their classroom doors at drop-off and pick-up. We have also had a few situations where students get over-excited when they approach a dog on the school grounds and end up causing that dog considerable stress, occasionally resulting in a negative interaction for both human and dog. We ask that, if your dog comes with you to pick up or drop off, you please wait *well away* from the building. Dogs should wait at the fence in the front, on the walkway to the South, beyond the playground to the North, and on the gravel field at the back of the school. Also, parents of children without dogs, please remind your children that they should always ask the owner's permission to pet a strange dog (or even a familiar one in a new situation) before reaching out. If we all work together, we can provide a safe, stress-free environment for all members of our community, human and canine.

K-12 COVID-19 Rapid Response Team
